
## Take a tour inside your new public hospital

You are invited to the first community tour to be held inside Fiona Stanley Hospital (FSH) on Wednesday 19, Friday 21 and Sunday 23 March 2014 respectively.


The tours are open to everyone and will give members of the community and staff who will be working at FSH, the opportunity to walk inside the main hospital building and see unique features of the hospital for the very first time.

The tours will provide a general overview of FSH, including the main hospital concourse and selected rooms on a ward. Visitors will then proceed outside and pass by the State rehabilitation service, mental health and the emergency department (visitors are advised to wear sun protection). ▶2

The tours are approximately 1km in length and 45 minutes duration. They are fully accessible to prams, wheelchairs and mobility scooters.

Free parking will be available on the hospital grounds, but visitors are encouraged to catch public transport.

FSH is less than a ten minute walk from Murdoch Train Station and regular buses also run between the station and the hospital's main entrance.

# FSH opening schedule

## Update

As we get closer to the start of FSH's first opening phase, more specific details have been revealed surrounding the dates.

On Tuesday, 3 February 2015 at 7am the FSH emergency department will commence operations. The emergency department will feature:

- 51 acute patient treatment bays
- trauma and resuscitation services with ceiling-mounted x-ray gantries and direct access to computed tomography (CT) equipment
- an ambulatory care area for low acuity presentations (both paediatric and adult)
- 15 adult and 4 paediatric short-stay beds for patients who need more monitoring but are expected to be discharged home within 24 hours (12 hours for paediatric patients).

When the emergency department at FSH opens Fremantle Hospital's ED will close. All emergency care will be provided by FSH.

## GP Forums

Last month General Practitioners (GPs) from across the South metropolitan region were invited to FSH to participate in open forums with key clinical and executive staff.



The forums provided a general update on the commissioning of FSH and the transition of clinical services, as well as an opportunity for questions and discussions.

These sessions are important to both FSH and local GP's to develop an open platform for engagement and ensure that FSH continues to deliver essential information needed by the clinical community.

To continue this valuable practice of information sharing, more forums are planned for the future and will be aimed at non-government organisations, aged care providers, consumer and community groups. These events will be advertised shortly.

## Phased opening schedule

4 OCTOBER 2014

### Phase 1

State rehabilitation service, pathology, pharmacy and medical imaging providing support as required

17 NOVEMBER 2014

### Phase 2A

General medicine (one 24-bed ward), general surgical (one 24-bed ward), orthopaedics, anaesthetics and some intensive care capability

2 DECEMBER 2014

### Phase 2B

Obstetrics, gynaecology and neonates

3 FEBRUARY 2015

### Phase 3

Emergency department, majority of all other specialities, outpatient services and burns

23 MARCH 2015

### Phase 4

Heart and lung transplant services

# Recruitment update

The internal process for identifying staff from South Metropolitan Health Service (SMHS) sites who may move to FSH as part of the wider service reconfiguration is almost complete.

Over the next few months recruitment to remaining allied health, health science, medical and nursing positions at FSH will take place. To facilitate this there are currently a range of SMHS nursing pools open for the specialty areas of maternity, neonates, emergency, mental health and perioperative.
