Celebrations as FSH officially declared open

Fiona Stanley Hospital was officially declared open on Friday 3 October in front of over 300 honourable guests.

The event was marked by a welcome to country from Reverend Sealin Garlett and speeches from Premier Colin Barnett, Minister for Health Dr Kim Hames and Professor Fiona Stanley. Two commemorative plaques were unveiled that will be installed in the hospital and visible for years to come.

Held in the main hospital concourse, the event later moved into the main courtyard where the guests participated in a traditional aboriginal smoking

ceremony conducted by Ben Taylor.

After the official ceremony was complete FSH staff were treated to a more intimate address from Professor Fiona Stanley in the main lecture theatre where she received a standing ovation from all.

Professor Fiona Stanley spoke about the legacy that the hospital would leave for the people of Western Australia and the opportunity to provide the best health care and world-class research.

Patients arrive from Shenton Park Campus

Shenton Park Campus passed the baton to the FSH State Rehabilitation Service on Saturday 4 October to continue their 121 year tradition of providing essential rehabilitative care to Western Australians.

The first patient, 25 year old Nathan Milliar, arrived before 9am and was later welcomed by Health Minister Dr Kim Hames who visited his ward and room.

In the largest planned patient move ever attempted in WA, 83 patients were transported to FSH to continue their rehabilitation journey in the 140-bed purpose built facility.

The move was planned and completed through the collaborative efforts of the Department of Health, St John Ambulance, the Department of Fire and Emergency Services, Main Roads and WA Police.
