Service profile	 10-bed inpatient palliative care unit in separate wing of St John of God Geraldton Hospital (SJGGH). Accommodates private, DVA and public patients from the Midwest region. Offering comprehensive medical, nursing and allied health care to patients, carers and families when facing life-limiting illnesses (malignant and non-malignant). Services include: symptom management planning for discharge into community end of life care psychological support for patient and families as required during severe carer distress bereavement support. Other clinical services available on site including Pathology, Radiology and Chemotherapy.

Admission criteria	 Access by referral from GP, treating doctor or the Midwest Palliative Care Service. Midwest Palliative Care Service must approve public patient's admission. A SJGGH accredited medical practitioner must accept patient prior to admission.

Palliative care discharge criteria	Discharge is based on medical practitioner, clinical stability, patient's care goal and plan for ongoing care in the community. Alternative care arrangements may be made in consultation with patient and family when home is no longer a viable option for care.
