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Allied health services	<ul> <li>Access to generalist allied health professionals, including:</li> <li>Social Worker</li> <li>Aboriginal Liaison</li> <li>Dietitian</li> <li>Occupational Therapist</li> <li>Physiotherapist</li> <li>Speech Therapist</li> <li>Pharmacist (medication reconcilliation).</li> </ul>
Admission criteria	Active, progressive and advanced disease (malignant or non-malignant) with limited prognosis requiring specialist consultation and/or symptom management and support.
Referral process	<ul> <li>All referrals require the consent of the patient:</li> <li>Urgent referrals by phone call to Clinical Nurse followed up with completion of Specialist Palliative Care Referral form</li> <li>In hospital eReferrals.</li> </ul>
Palliative care discharge criteria	Based on discretion of the Palliative Care team following discharge planning process and in discussion with the primary team, the patient, their carer/family and GP.
Niche services	<ul> <li>Visiting Palliative Care Physician clinics:</li> <li>Kalgoorlie, Esperance and via Telehealth.</li> <li>Consultation with Aboriginal rural health services:</li> <li>Tjuntjunjarra, Ngaanyatgarra communities and BEGA Health.</li> <li>Consultation with Rural Cancer Services:</li> <li>Kalgoorlie and Esperance.</li> <li>Consultation with Rural Renal Services:</li> <li>Kalgoorlie and Warburton.</li> </ul>
