



Take a tour inside your new public hospital

Fiona Stanley Hospital community tours

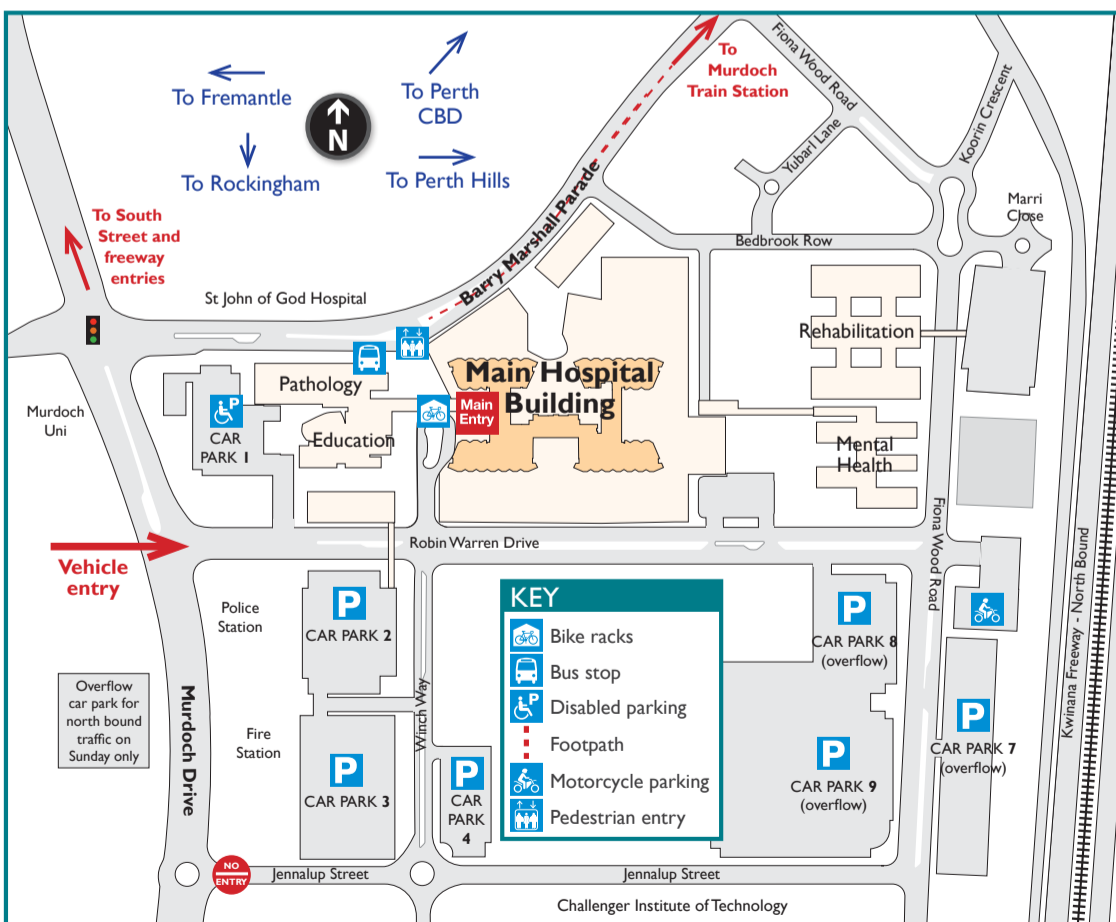
Sunday 7 September 2014

9am to 3pm (tours will depart at 15 minute intervals)

Tours start from the main entrance, Fiona Stanley Hospital, Murdoch. Cars enter from Murdoch Drive onto Robin Warren Drive; public transport passengers, pedestrians and cyclists enter via Barry Marshall Parade (see map below). Last tour leaves at 3pm.

Your last opportunity to see inside the State's newest public tertiary hospital ahead of its opening from October 2014.

Tours are unreserved and will leave every 15 minutes. As the final tours before the first phase of opening, they will again provide a general overview of Fiona Stanley Hospital, with visitors taken through the main hospital concourse and into selected rooms on a ward, while unique features of the hospital are pointed out along the way. The tours will then proceed outside and pass by the State rehabilitation service, mental health and the emergency department (visitors are advised to wear sun protection).



These are set tours of approximately 1km in length and 45 minutes duration. They are fully accessible to prams, wheelchairs and mobility scooters.

Free parking will be available on the hospital grounds, but visitors are encouraged to catch public transport. Fiona Stanley Hospital is less than a ten minute walk from Murdoch Train Station and regular buses also run between the station and the hospital's main entrance.
