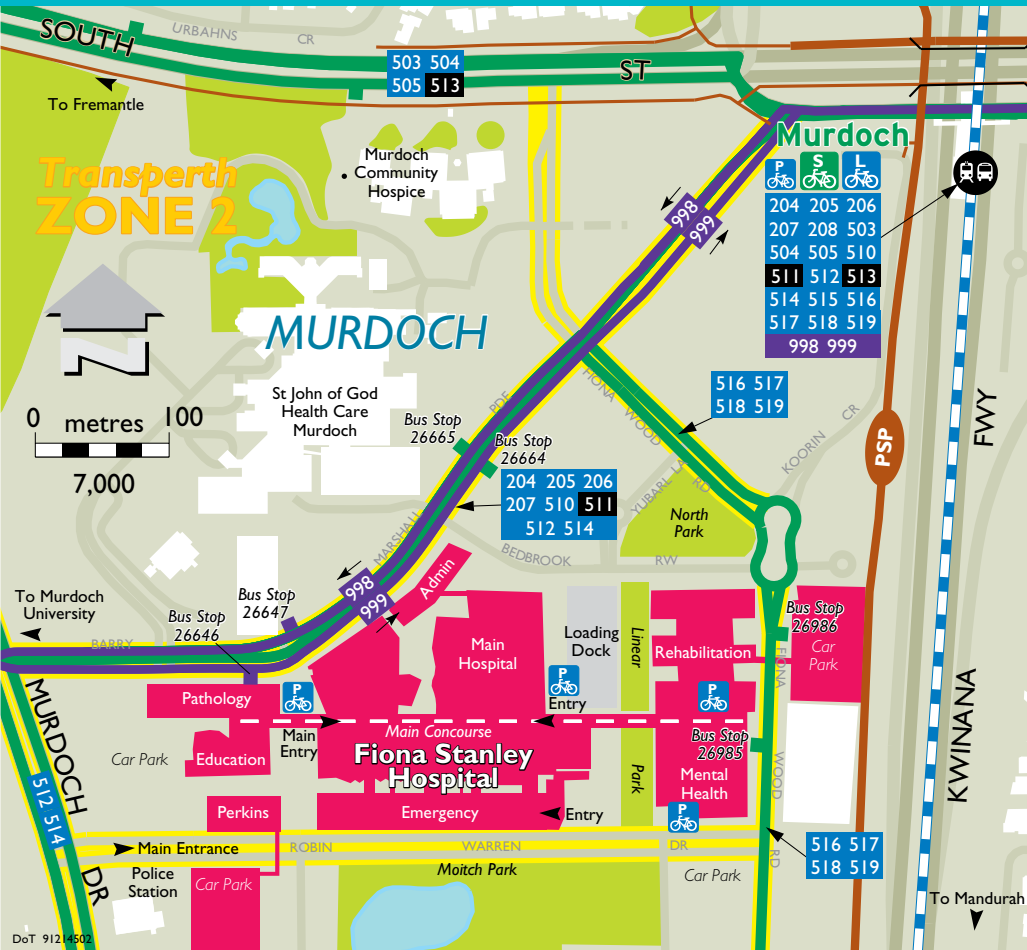

Walk

If you live nearby in Leeming, Bullcreek, Bateman, Murdoch or Winthrop you may only be a short walk away from FSH. If you don't live close enough to walk, why not add some physical activity into your day and walk or ride to your closest train station or bus stop that will connect you with FSH.

Cycle

If you ride your bicycle to FSH, you are well catered for. The Principal Shared Path runs along the Kwinana Freeway and allows easy access from the north and south. Shared paths are also available on South Street and there are additional local paths within the surrounding suburbs.

Visitors have access to several bike racks across the site, at both the western and eastern entrances to the main hospital building. There are also bike racks available outside the Education, Mental Health and State Rehabilitation buildings.

Connect with FSH

Visitor and patient parking is available in the multi-deck car parks 1, 2 and 5 at the western and eastern ends of the hospital site which include bays for people with a disability or limited mobility.

Make your Move

How to get to Fiona Stanley Hospital for visitors and patients





Choosing active ways to get to Fiona Stanley Hospital (FSH) can be a great step to a healthy lifestyle. You can travel by foot, bicycle or public transport.

## Public transport

Fiona Stanley Hospital is a short 10 minute walk (800m) from **Murdoch Train Station** and there are numerous bus services that run regularly between the station and the hospital.

Bus stops can be found on Barry Marshall Parade and Fiona Wood Road. Services stopping on **Barry Marshall Parade** include the following routes:

- **204** and **205** from Murdoch University to Maddington Station.
- **206** from Murdoch University to Cannington Station via Thornlie Station.
- **207** from Murdoch University to Thornlie Station.
- **510** from Booragoon Bus Station to Murdoch Station.
- **511** from Fremantle Station to Murdoch Station.
- **512** from Murdoch Station to Spearwood Ave/Hamilton Road.
- **514** from Murdoch Station to Cockburn Central Station.
- **998** and **999** are the Circle Route services that run very regularly and service Murdoch University, Curtin University and the

University of Western Australia as well as various train stations and shopping centres across the city.

Services stopping on **Fiona Wood Road** include the following routes:

- **518** from the South Metropolitan TAFE Murdoch Campus to Cockburn Central Station.
- **519** from the South Metropolitan TAFE Murdoch Campus to Armadale Station.
